UNIQUE WAYS TO GIVE

Aluminum cans are raising money through recycling to build Habitat for Humanity homes. Through an innovative program, "Aluminum Cans Build Habitat for Humanity Homes" (ACBHHH), over 500 affiliates across the nation are working with local recyclers to raise money for Habitat homes.

The Aluminum Association recently awarded 17 Habitat affiliates grants totaling \$167,500 for outstanding recycling efforts. One affiliate in Yuma, Arizona, began the recycling program eight years ago, and to date, they have earned \$115,000, enough for three homes, and received a \$15,000 grant from The Aluminum Association.

Shaaron Dodd, Volunteer Coordinator, initiated the program for our St. Johns County Habitat. **The Florida School for the Deaf and Blind** took 15 bins for their dorms. **The Palencia Club** took five bins for the golf course and snack bar areas.

Everyone is welcome to participate. The program accepts **aluminum cans** only, and if possible, rinsed and crushed.

TRASH 2 CASH, an established recycling program for collection and processing laser and inkjet printer cartridges, has presented our affiliate with \$555 over a three month period. Bring used cartridges to the Habitat office and make a tax deductible donation without spending a cent.
